Course Information for Students and Parents

- 1. Most courses meet only one semester, meeting c.70 minutes per day (for example: English); some courses will be taught through the full year, meeting c.40 minutes day (Music).
- 2. Course types:

University preparation courses will provide you with the knowledge and skills necessary to meet the requirements for entrance to university programs. These courses are designated with a "U" in the course code.

University/college preparation courses will provide you with the knowledge and skills necessary to meet the requirements for entrance to university and/or college programs. These courses are designated with an "M" in the course codes.

College preparation courses will provide you with the knowledge and skills necessary to meet the requirements for entrance to college programs. These courses are designated with a "C" in the course codes.

Workplace preparation courses will provide you with the knowledge and skills necessary to meet employer's expectations with regard to preparation for direct entry to the workplace. These courses are designated with an "E" in the course codes.

Open courses are not developed to meet the specific requirements of universities, colleges or the workplace, but are intended to enrich your lives and to prepare you for active and rewarding participation in society. These courses are designated with an "O" in the course codes.

3. Students are expected to fulfil the requirements of the Unity Christian High School diploma as well as the Ontario Secondary School diploma. These requirements are as follows:

UCHS Diploma Requirements

In order to obtain a UCHS Diploma, students must fulfill all of the requirements of the OSSD as well as:

- Successfully complete the Senior Project course.
- 2. Contribute to the Graduate portfolio.
- 3. Be involved in at least two co-curricular activities.
- 4. Complete the three credits of Worldview (9), Bible (10), and Perspectives (12).
- Complete the 40 hours of Unity for Christ Service Learning, as per the OSSD requirements.
- 6. Participate in all Unity retreat and service days unless excused by the Administration.
- ** Note: Students transferring to Unity Christian High School in grades 10, 11, or 12 may obtain a Unity Christian High School certificate instead of a UCHS diploma. See the Course Calendar for details.

Ontario Secondary School (OSSD) Requirements

Under regulations of the Ontario Ministry of Education, in order to receive an OSSD, any student entering grade 9 must obtain the following:

- 1. 18 Compulsory credits
 - 4 English
 - 1 French
 - 3 Mathematics
 - 2 Science
 - 1 Canadian Geography
 - 1 Canadian History
 - 1 Arts
 - 1 Physical Education
 - 0.5 Civics
 - 0.5 Career studies
 - 3 credits 1 from each of Group 1, Group 2, and Group 3 respectively. See Course Calendar for details.
- 2. 12 Optional credits
- 3. 40 hours of community service
- 4. Successful completion of the Ontario Literacy test (or the grade 12 Literacy course)
